- (1) You must also have a grade of B or better in ACCT 2200 and ACCT 2210 or their equivalents.
- (2) You must also have C or better in 3 computer science classes prior to becoming a declared (or unconditionally accepted) major.
- (3) Once enrolled at Kean University, undergraduate education students must formally apply to declare their respective education program. The declaration process for teacher preparation programs may include passing the PRAXIS I and, providing faculty recommendations and biographical information, among other requirements. - (4) Applicants in this program will need to select an academic content area for a teachable subject (i.e., History, English, Biology, etc.) as part of the degree requirements.
- (5) Graduates from this program receive both Elementary and Middle School certification.
- (6) The RN to BSN program is open only to those who already hold a valid New Jersey Registered Nurse (RN) license. No lower division, introductory nursing courses are offered at Kean University. New graduates of diploma or associate degree Nursing programs, who are eligible to take the NCLEX, may apply as "intended majors." Intended majors who are otherwise qualified for admission will be admitted to the Nursing major upon successful completion of the NCLEX. The program is accredited by the National League of Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC). Admission is competitive and based on Department of Nursing criteria. - (7) You must also complete four of the following courses or their equivalents with a 2.3 G.P.A. or better: ECO 1020, ECO 1021, MGS 2030, MGS 2110, MGS 2120, ACCT 2200, ACCT 2205, FIN 3310, MKT 3410.
- (8) Graduates from this program are also dual certified in Special Education.
