- The 5-8 endorsement (subject matter specialization) is available to those whose academic major is: English, History, Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology, Earth Science, or Spanish.
- To be eligible for the elementary school with subject matter with specialization endorsement, the candidate must pass the Elementary Content Knowledge Praxis and the Praxis in the area of specialization: Biology, Earth Science, Spanish, Mathematics, History, English.

Writing-Emphasis Requirement: All students are required to complete at least one Writing-Emphasis course. The (WE) course should be within the major.

Prior to admission to the Department of Special Education and Teacher of Students with Disabilities Program, the following criteria must be met:

- A cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or better;
- A speech and language screening test (please call 908-737-5819 for an appointment on campus);
- A minimum grade of "B-" in ENG 1030: Composition;
- A minimum grade of "B-" in MATH 1000: College Algebra;
- A minimum grade of "B-" in ID 2052: Human Exceptionality;
- A minimum grade of "B-" in COMM 1402; Speech Comm. As Critical Citizenship
- Satisfactory completion (with a grade of B- or better) of SPED 2120 (Introductory Field Experience), or in the case of transfer students, an equivalent experience; and SPED 2200;
- Achieve a passing score on Praxis I;
- A minimum of 60 credits.

Exit Requirements:

- A cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or better;
- Satisfactory completion of all course requirements.

GENERAL EDUCATION INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

TESTING and PLACEMENT

Incoming freshman and transfer students may be placed in specific GE Foundations, Developmental, or ESL courses as a result of testing prior to registration. Students may be exempt from testing due to SAT scores or prior college work.

GE DISTRIBUTION COURSES

All courses taken under the General Education Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary Distribution requirements must be selected from the Approved General Education Distribution Course List, printed in the Registration Bulletin. These courses are designated as **GEHU**, **GESS**, **GESM**, or **GEHPE**.

REQUIRED GE DISTRIBUTION COURSES

ENG 2403 is a **required** Humanities Distribution course with an emphasis on diversity.

HIST 1000 is a **required** Social Sciences Distribution course with an emphasis on diversity.

MAJOR/GE CAPSTONE COURSE

A Capstone course is a major course that satisfies three credits of GE requirements. Each major guide sheet will count three credits for the Capstone as either GE credits or major credits, but not both.

UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENT: WRITING-EMPHASIS

All students are required to complete one "Writing-Emphasis" course. The "W-E" course **must** be within the major portion of your program. Consult your major program advisor for specific information.
