**Free Electives:** At least 50% of Free Electives must be at 3000-4000 level. English majors may not use ENG major courses as Free Electives. Free Electives can be used to complete a minor (generally 18-24 credits) in another discipline. **Summer Courses:** Kean offers two summer sessions each year. Students may take two courses (or seven credits, whichever is greater) in each summer session.
