Footnotes: <sup>1</sup> See prerequisites, equivalencies and foreign language credit information on page 3. <sup>2</sup> University requirement for graduation for all undergraduate students that must be satisfied in one of two ways: Complete GE 1000 (all freshmen and transfers entering with 0-29 credits) OR complete GE 3000 (transfers entering with 30 credits or more). <sup>3</sup> Students may be required to take ENG 1025 Introduction to Composition as a prerequisite for ENG 1030. <sup>4</sup> ENG 1030 and COMM 1402 require a grade of "B-" or better. <sup>5</sup> Lab science and Math 1000 require a grade of "C" or better. <sup>6</sup> PSY 1000 is a prerequisite for PSY 2110. <sup>7</sup> A maximum of two C's is permitted in all English courses. All other grades in English courses must be at least a B-. <sup>8</sup> ENG 4800 serves as a capstone course for both the English major and the GE Program and fulfills the Writing Emphasis requirement. <sup>9</sup> Grade of "B-" or better required in all Professional Education courses (except EMSE 3801 and EMSE 4811 which require grade of <i>Satisfactory</i> ); Must maintain GPA of 3.0 or higher to be eligible to take Professional Education courses. <sup>10</sup> Should be completed before Clinical I <sup>11</sup> EMSE 4711 & EMSE 4811: Requires submission of application to the Teaching Performance Center. <sup>12</sup> Clinical I and II must be done back-to-back and in consecutive semesters. <sup>13</sup> Should be done in conjunction with Clinical I. <sup>14</sup> Clinical II Prerequisite: Passing score on the Praxis II: A passing score on the appropriate Praxis II score must be submitted to the Teaching Performance Center by the TPC's required deadline. No student may enter Clinical II unless the passing score is submitted as required. <sup>15</sup> As an NJDOE requirement, Clinical II must be done in the final semester prior to graduation and taken in conjunction with EDUC 4000, the capstone education class. Any additional course work left to that final Clinical II semester is discouraged and may only be done with the written permission of the dean of education. All students are highly encouraged to complete all course requirements beyond EMSE 4811 (Clinical II) and EDUC 4000 prior to this final Clinical II semester, as even a few remaining credits will delay NJDOE's issue date of the Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing.  Writing-Emphasis (WE) Requirement: All students are required to complete at least one WE course. Both ENG 4800 and EMSE 3210 serve as WE courses.

## Testing and Placement

Incoming freshmen and transfer students may be placed in specific GE Foundations, Developmental or ESL courses as a result of testing prior to registration. Students may be exempt from testing due to SAT scores or prior college work.

### **MATH 1000 or 1010 or 1016 or 1030**

Prereq: MATH 0901 if required by placement testing  
Equiv of MATH 1000: MATH 1001/1002, MATH 1003/1004, MATH 1051

### **MATH 1044 or 1054**

Prereq: MATH 0901 if required by placement testing and MATH 1000

### **COMM 1402**

Prereq: CS 0412 if required by placement testing  
ENG 1031/1032 or ENG 1033/1034 if required by placement testing  
May be taken concurrently with ENG 1030  
Equiv: COMM 1400

## Required GE Distribution Courses

**ENG 2403** is a required Humanities Distribution course.  
Prereq: CS 0412 if required by placement testing; ENG 1030 or equivalent.

**HIST 1062** is a required Social Sciences Distribution course.

## Foreign Language Credit

The three credits for a foreign language that may satisfy the GE Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary Distribution Humanities Requirement are awarded only upon successful completion of the second of two semesters of study at the introductory or intermediate level.  
Credit for the first semester may be used as free elective credit.

## Major/GE Capstone Course

A Capstone course is a major course that satisfies three credits of GE requirements.  
Each major guide sheet will count three credits for the Capstone as either GE credits or major credits, but not both.
