		14. As an NJDOE requirement, Clinical II must be done in the final semester
		prior to graduation and taken in conjunction with SPED 4200, the capstone
		education class. Any additional coursework left to that final Clinical II
		semester is discouraged and may only be done with the written permission of
		the Dean of Education. All students are highly encouraged to complete all course requirements beyond EMSE 4811 (Clinical II) and SPED 4200 prior to
		this final Clinical II semester, as even a few remaining credits will delay
		NJDOE's issue date of the Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing.
		15. No English courses can be used as Free Electives except for ENG 1996
		Research and ENG 3291/3292/3293 Internship.
		16. Freshman may partner with faculty to earn one credit as a free elective,
		which may be taken up to two times. 17. Majors may enroll in internships, if available, for 1 or 2 credits (ENG
		3291 and 3292, respectively) for a maximum of two credits. Prerequisites are
		ENG 3001 or ENG 3029; 75 credits.
		18. ENG 2403 and HIST 1062 are G.E. Distribution Courses required of all
		Students.
		19. ENG 2000 is a prerequisite for ENG 2205, ENG 2206 and ENG 3001,
		and it is recommended to take before other literature courses.
		20. Most English major courses require ENG 2403 as a prerequisite; pre/corequisites may change; some courses may require approved petitions
