

Master of Arts in Special Education Option: Applied Behavior Analysis and Autism Spectrum Disorders -Launching Fall 2025: Fully Remote Hybrid Learning

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If you're working toward becoming a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst® (BCBA®), Kean University's ABA master's program fulfills two of the three eligibility requirements set by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB): a qualifying master's degree and 315 hours of graduate-level coursework under Pathway 2, aligned with the 2027 exam standards.

No teaching certification needed to join our ABA MA program, just a passion for making a difference! Teachers are welcome, too!

Program Description: This program has been designed to meet the BACB's BCBA® Pathway 2 coursework requirements. Applicants will need to meet additional requirements to qualify to sit for the BCBA exam. The program includes seven courses that cover the 315 hours of required coursework for the BCBA® exam starting in 2027 under Pathway 2. For details on the current exam requirements, visit <u>www.BACB.com</u>. To practice ABA in New Jersey, you must also meet statewide licensure requirements, which include BACB certification.

Admission Requirements

In addition to the University's admissions requirements:

- Baccalaureate with a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average
- Official transcripts from all institutions attended
- Three Letters of Recommendation (professional experience)
- An appropriate scholarly writing sample (APA style, if available) send a paper from your undergraduate work}
- Professional resume/CV
- Personal Statement (Why do you want to be accepted?)
- Official TOEFL or IELTS score reports (International Students Only)

- Courses combine live Zoom sessions with self-paced online work:
- Synchronous Weeks: Live online classes for real-time learning and discussion.
- Asynchronous Weeks: <u>No live meetings</u>; complete coursework on your schedule (with weekly deadlines).

Fully Remote Hybrid Program Requirements

- 27-credit course sequence (10 classes, including 7 BACB Pathway 2-required courses)
- 9 credits of Research (Master's Thesis 3 courses)
 - Taken over final two years, after passing SPED 7900 in Fall of 2nd year
 - Must be completed in consecutive semesters; each is a prerequisite for the next
 - Sequence:
 - Spring (2nd Year): SPED 7906
 - Fall (Final Year): SPED 7907
 - Spring (Final Year): SPED 7908
 - Note: Courses cannot be taken in the same semester and must be passed in order

SP 2nd year of study: SPED 7903 and SPED 7906 (must take in this semester to stay on track)
Summer: SPED 5020 and/or SPED 5023 (if not previously taken)
Fall 2nd Last year of study: SPED 7907 (must take in this semester to stay on track)
SP Last year of study: SPED 7908 (must take in this semester to stay on track)

Recommended Schedule if beginning in Spring Semester

SP 1st Year of study: SPED 5100, 5101 and SPED 5102

Summer: SPED 5005 (if not taken the previous semester) and/or SPED 5020

Fall 2nd Year of study: SPED 7900 (must take in this semester to stay on track), and SPED 5103

SP 2nd year of study: SPED 7906 (must take in this semester to stay on track), and SPED 5200

Summer: SPED 5020 and/or SPED 5023 (if not previously taken)

Fall 2nd Last year of study: SPED 7907 (must take in this semester to stay on track)
