Work on confidence to secure yourself in your career

By junior year, you should have some internship, volunteer, shadowing, or work experience. If you don't, getting this should be your number one priority!

• Continue searching for more opportunities on LinkedIn, Indeed, College Central, etc. Think about what areas you would be interested in researching! For some areas of study, having completed research projects is vital for grad school acceptance or workplace success. Talk to your academic advisor about doing an independent study!

Leadership roles on campus allow you to get involved and can help strengthen your resume!

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Schedule exams for grad school!

- Give yourself enough time to take the tests more than once
- Use test prep tools like Kaplan, Khan Academy, Magoosh etc.

Update your resume regularly! Meet with your career advisor for mock interviewers, resume editing, or other career advice! If you haven't already, find a mentor!

- A career mentor will help you become the best version of yourself in your career.
- You will need letters of recommendation in the future, and now is the time you build relationships that lead to letters. Go to office hours, ask questions, and do your best to connect with your professors.
- Don't expect people to know who you are if you do not put the effort into getting to know them!
