⁶ All grades in Professional Education courses must be B- or better (except EMSE 4711 and EMSE 4811 which require grade of *Satisfactory*).

Testing and Placement

Incoming freshmen and transfer students may be placed in specific GE Essential Learning, Developmental, or ESL courses as a result of testing prior to registration. Students may be exempt from testing due to SAT scores or prior college work.

Pre-requisite: MATH*0901 if required by placement testing

Co-requisite: MATH*0902 should be taken concurrently with Math*1016 if required by placement testing

Pre-requisite: MATH*0901 if required by placement testing and MATH*1000

COMM*1402

Pre-requisite: ENG*1031/1032 or ENG*1033/1034 if required by placement testing; May be taken concurrently with ENG*1030

Equivalency: COMM*1400

All courses taken under the General Education Essential Learning and Core Competency requirements must be selected from the Approved General Education PLO Course List.

Foreign Language Credit

The three credits for a foreign language that may satisfy the GE Intercultural Knowledge & Understanding requirement are awarded only upon successful completion of the second of two semesters of study at the introductory or intermediate level. Credit for the first semester may be used as an elective.

UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

GE 1000/3000 Requirement

All undergraduate students must satisfy this University Requirement for Graduation by successfully completing one of the following courses at Kean University: GE 1000 Transition to Kean (all freshmen and transfers entering with 0-29 credits) or GE 3000 Transfer Transitions (transfers entering with 30 credits or more).

Writing-Emphasis Requirement

To graduate, all students are required to complete at least one "Writing Emphasis" course within their major. Such courses are designed to provide students with an opportunity to explore writing as it is done in their chosen field. Typically, Writing Emphasis courses are taken in the junior or senior year, after the student's initial composition courses are completed. Students should consult their major program advisor for specific information about the Writing Emphasis course requirement.

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Prior to admission to the Department of Special Education and Teacher of Students with Disabilities Program, the following criteria must be met:

- A cumulative grade point average of **3.00** or better;
- A speech and language screening test (please call **908.737.5810** for an appointment on campus);
- A minimum grade of “**B**” in **ENG 1030**: Composition;
- A minimum grade of “**B**” in **MATH 1000**: College Algebra;
- A minimum grade of “**B**” in **SPED 2056**: Human Exceptionality;
- A minimum grade of “**B**” in **COMM 1402**: Speech Communication;
- Satisfactory completion (with a grade of **B** or better) of **EMSE 2801** (Introductory Field Experience), or in the case of transfer students, an equivalent experience and **SPED 2200**;
- A minimum of **60** credits.

To be admitted to student teaching, students must pass the appropriate Praxis II exam given by ETS. Before enrolling for the test, check that you are registering for the correct exam.

Exit Requirements:

- A cumulative grade point average of **3.00** or better;
- Satisfactory completion of all course requirements.
