# Testing and Placement

Incoming freshmen and transfer students may be placed in specific GE Foundations, Developmental or ESL courses as a result of testing prior to registration. Students may be exempt from testing due to SAT scores or prior college work.

# **GE Distribution Courses**

#### Approved GE Distribution Courses

All courses taken under the General Education Disciplinary/ Interdisciplinary Distribution requirements must be selected from the Approved General Education Distribution Course List. These courses are designated as GEHU, GESS, and GESM. GEHU Humanities GESS Social Sciences GESM Science and Mathematics

#### **Required GE Distribution Courses**

**ENG 2403** is a required Humanities Distribution course with an emphasis on diversity. Prereq: CS 0412 if required by placement testing; ENG 1030 or equivalent Equiv: ENG\*2203

<u>HIST 1062</u> is a required Social Sciences Distribution course. Prereq: None

# Foreign Language Credit

The three credits for a foreign language that may satisfy theGE Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary Distribution Requirements are awarded only upon successful completion of the second of two semesters of study at the introductory or intermediate level. Credit for the first semester may be used as elective credit.
