## \*Secondary Education Major Notes:

## A grade of B- or better is required in all education courses.

Acceptance into the University is NOT acceptance into the Secondary Education Department. This is a separate process. No education courses beyond EMSE 2801 may be taken until student is declared into the program. Criteria for admission/declaration includes:

- A. Minimum Kean GPA of 3.0
- B. Completion of/with minimum grade of: ENG 1030 (B-); COMM 1402 (B-); EMSE 2801 (B-); Lab Science ( C ); Math ( C )
- C. Passing score on PRAXIS Core Academic Skills Test
- D. Two Letters of Recommendation
- E. Filing of a formal application for admission and arranging an interview

- c. EMSE 4711 and EMSE 4811 must be done back-to-back and in consecutive semesters.
- d. Should be done in conjunction with EMSE 4711.
- e. Requires submission of application to Teaching Performance Center (TPC). f. EMSE 4811 Prerequisite: Passing Score on the Praxis II: A passing score on the appropriate score must be submitted to the TPC by the TPC deadline. No student may enter EMSE 4811 unless the passing score is submitted as required.
- g. NJDOE Requirement: Clinical II must be done in final semester prior to graduation and taken in conjunction with EDUC 4000. Any additional coursework left to final semester is discouraged and may only be done with written permission of Dean of the College of Ed. Students are highly encouraged to complete all courses beyond EMSE 4811 and EDUC 4000 prior to final Clinical III semester. Even a few remaining credits will delay NJDOE's issue of Certificate of Eligibility with Advances Standing.
