

# Sophomores: 30-60 credits

- **Attend** as many campus events as possible
- **Get involved** Participate in clubs, organizations, and extracurricular activities.
- **Take care of your grades**, attend tutoring sessions when needed.
- **Seek advisement**, ask your advisor(s) for guidance and available opportunities. Track your academic progress and register for classes early to avoid course cancellations and get a good schedule
- **Explore** majors and minors. If you are still not sure about what major to pursue, attend the major/minor fair and do your own research into career options
- **Learn** how to read your student progress on Student Planning and review your graduation requirements to ensure you are on the right track
- **Complete your FAFSA or the HESAA Alternative Financial Aid Application** (for students who qualify under the Dream Act). Check your financial account to ensure you complete any requirements if selected for verification.
- **Apply for Scholarships** many opportunities are now available to you based on your sophomore status
- **Start Exploring Careers Options**; visit Career Services and inquire about internships and job opportunities in your field. As a sophomore, you need to start building your resume.
- **Prepare and take career-related exams**, if applicable, e.g., Praxis.
