Konopack's own academic background includes a bachelor of arts in Psychology from Cornell University, a master of education in Counseling from Boston University, and a PhD in Kinesiology from the University of Illinois, where he was the recipient of an F31 individual predoctoral fellowship from the National Institute of Mental Health and the department's "most outstanding graduate student" award. Previous to his deanship at Salus University, he held appointments at New Jersey City University and Monmouth University, where he earned tenure and promotion for his research in human aging and the psychosocial determinants and consequences of physical activity and was recognized as the "Distinguished Teacher of the Year" in 2017.

Konopack was born and raised in Hunterdon County and resides with his wife Sheryl and their two teenage children in Howell, NJ. A nature lover and trail runner, he has nearly completed his goal of running a marathon or ultramarathon in each state.
