

Minor in Urban Education

This academic minor will cultivate critical consciousness about urban schools and the communities they serve. Students will take courses specifically in urban education, as well as courses across other academic disciplines that make central identity, oppression, and power in their scholarly inquiries. Coursework will emphasize the theoretical, practical, and research skills needed to understand and disrupt the educational and societal problems impacting urban schools. Open to enrollees within any degree program, the minor will prepare students to work toward dismantling racialized educational injustices, whether as school-based educators (e.g., teachers, principals, school psychologists) or within professional roles that inevitably impact urban education (e.g., politicians, lawyers, entrepreneurs, etc.).
