PsyD program: Overarching goal and accreditation

The preparation of school and clinical psychologists capable of the ethical delivery of effective evidence-based assessment/diagnostic and therapeutic/intervention services across a variety of settings, in a variety of professional roles, and to diverse client populations in need of such services

Accreditations

- American Psychological Associated (APA) accredited 2016 through 2023
- National Association of School Psychologists accredited 2017



Structure of program and related considerations

- Combined school and clinical training for all students
- Most classes during the day
- Full-time program throughout most of calendar year
- Students expected to travel to and present at professional conferences
- Geographic flexibility for internship year expected
- Small cohort size (~10-12 students)
- Limited number of graduate assistantships
 - 15-20 hours of work within/outside the department
 - Tuition remission and small stipend
 - Graduate assistants may not hold outside employment that interferes in any way with their assistantship responsibilities



Programmatic milestones

Year 1

- Coursework/academic focus (classes 4 days/week)
- Serve as participant observers and intake assessments at Kean Psychological Services (KPS)
- Research team involvement (throughout program)

Year 2

- Classes 3-4 days/week
- School externship
- Caseload at KPS
- School competency exams
- Clinical assessment competency exam

Programmatic milestones (cont.)

Year 3

- Classes 2-3 days/week
- Clinical externship
- Caseload at KPS
- Clinical intervention competency exam
- Dissertation proposal development and defense

Year 4

- Classes 2-3 days/week
- Optional school or clinical externship
- Caseload at KPS
- Dissertation data collection and finalization (Years 4 & 5)

Year 5 – full-time internship (or part-time completed over 2 years)

Outcomes for PsyD students/ graduates

- Internship match process
 - Outcomes
 - ▶ 2013: 88.5% APPIC match rate; 100% obtained internships
 - > 2014: 88.5% APPIC match rate; 100% obtained internships
 - > 2015: 78.8% APPIC match rate; 100% obtained internships
 - ▶ 2016: 75% APPIC match rate; 90% obtained internships
 - > 2017: 87.5% APPIC match rate; 100% obtained internships
 - ▶ 2018 and 2019: 100% APPIC match rate

Mix of clinical and school placements

- Nearly 100% of graduates in postdoctoral fellowships or professional positions in psychology (e.g., independent practice, academic medical centers/hospitals, schools, community mental health centers, academic settings, forensic settings)
- National licensing exam (Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology) pass rates upper 90%

Kean Psychological Services

- Dedicated Psy.D. training clinic
- Psy.D. students provide all clinical assessment and intervention services, supervised by faculty
- Rotating experiences over course of training
- Digital video recording
- Electronic medical records
- Telehealth services about to launch (6/2020)
- Evidence-based practice and research integration



PsyD research sequence

- Research intensive Psy.D. program
 Research teams run by each faculty
 Presentations at national conferences in school and clinical psychology
- Dissertation process that concludes with article submission
