Catalog Description:

The Sport and Event Management minor is designed to introduce students to the areas of study in the recreation, sport and event industry. Students will be able to apply skills and knowledge in the sport and event management fields to their major discipline and thus increase their employment opportunity.

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B. Description, Objectives, and Student Learning Outcomes for the Academic Program

1. Description and Rationale of the Program

The B.A. degree in Recreation Administration has two options: 1) Community Recreation and 2) Sport and Event Management. Sport and Event Management is one of the fastest growing fields. The number of undergraduate sport and event management programs grew to over 430 in the U.S. in 2017 and continues to grow (North American Society of Sport Management, 2018).

At present, there are four accredited higher education institutions in New Jersey that offer a minor in a Sport Management/Event Management-related field. Rutgers University offers a Sport Management minor in the Department of Kinesiology and Health, Rider University offers a Sport Studies in the College of Business, Saint Peters University offers a minor in Sports Management in the School of Business, William Patterson University offers a Sport Management minor in the Department of Kinesiology.

The Sport and Event Management minor at Kean is unique compared to sport management programs offered from other university. We combine recreation, sport, and event specific content to offer unique program that trains students in the recreation, sport and event fields, expanding their opportunities to find employment. In addition, as the sport and event management program is connected with the only existing recreation program offered in New Jersey (Kean University is only school in New Jersey that provides a Recreation Administration major), students may see extended job opportunities including government parks and recreation agencies and non-profit organizations. The proposed minor in Sport and Event Management will help to provide interdisciplinary approaches to the sport and event fields, along with encouraging students to expand their field of study. Such a minor can strengthen our students' ability to be more marketable and employable.

2. SLOs for Academic Program

Upon completion of the Sport and Event Management Minor, students will be able to:

SLO #1: Discuss knowledge about the concepts, natures, principles, and values of recreation, sport and event services.

SLO #2: Exhibit fundamental knowledge regarding management, marketing, finance, and legal aspects for the recreation, sport, and event fields.

SLO #3: Demonstrate effective skills in written and oral communications using appropriate skills and technologies

SLO #4: Demonstrate the ability to plan, organize, implement and evaluate events in diverse settings.

SLO #5: Apply the knowledge and skills necessary for professional practice in the in recreation, sport, and event professions and their associated industries.

D. Content of the Program

1. Schematic of Curriculum Plan

Students will be required to complete 18 credits for the minor. Three core courses (9 semester credit hours) and three additional elective courses from designated electives (9 credit hours) will be required for the completion of the minor program. The minor requires the students to maintain a grade of 'C' or better in all courses taken for the minor. Upon admission into the minor, students will be assigned a minor advisor. 2. Admission Requirements for Minor

In order to be admitted into the minor, students will need to have a 2.0 GPA and complete a declaration of minor form. Students required to have a minimum of a 2.0 GPA (in good standing) and meet with the Sport and Event Management Program Coordinator to complete a student information application. Please note that a minor is not required to complete an undergraduate degree. However, students must complete a minor according to the requirements, policies, and procedures specified by the School and the University.

Potential students will need to adhere to the following:

- Confirmation that the minor was completed during the verification process for graduation.
- At least half of the required minor courses must be completed at Kean University.
- Generally, a minor must be completed prior to or simultaneously with the student's major.
- The minor cannot be completed after graduating with a degree.

E. Administrative Structure

1. Primary Department or Office Administering the Program

The Sport and Event Management Minor Program will be housed in The School of Health and Human Performance.

F. Impact Statement to be developed with Appropriate Dean

1. Additional Faculty

An additional full-time faculty line for the Sport and Event Management Option is not required at this time. Currently, one full-time Recreation Administration faculty, along with adjunct instructors, will teach the necessary courses to assist students in fulfilling the requirements for the Sport Management and Event option. In addition, as enrollment continues to increase, it may be necessary to hire additional tenured faculty, lecturers or adjunct instructors.

2. Effects on Enrollment

This minor program will attract prospective students in the recreation, sport and event fields. It is anticipated to increase enrollment in the School of Health and Human Performance.

3. Additional Resources

As all the courses required for the minor exist in the sport and event management program, no additional resources will be required at start up.
