Sophomores: 30-60 credits

- Attend as many campus events as possible
- **Get involved** Participate in clubs, organizations, and extracurricular activities.
- Take care of your grades, attend tutoring sessions when needed.
- Seek advisement, ask your advisor(s) for guidance and available opportunities. Track your academic progress and register for classes early to avoid course cancellations and get a good schedule
- **Explore** majors and minors. If you are still not sure about what major to pursue, attend the major/minor fair and do your own research into career options
- Learn how to read your student progress on Student Planning and review your graduation requirements to ensure you are on the right track
- Complete your FAFSA or the HESAA Alternative Financial Aid Application (for students who qualify under the Dream Act). Check your financial account to ensure you complete any requirements if selected for verification.
- Apply for Scholarships many opportunities are now available to you based on your sophomore status
- Start Exploring Careers Options; visit Career Services and inquire about internships and job opportunities in your field. As a sophomore, you need to start building your resume.
- Prepare and take career-related exams, if applicable, e.g., Praxis.
