

Master of Arts in Special Education Option: Autism and Developmental Disabilities

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Program Description

The Master of Arts in Special Education, Autism and Developmental Disabilities prepares students to work in settings in which specialized assessments, practices in Applied Behavioral Analysis are implemented. Students with Autism and Developmental Disabilities are those individuals who have more severe/lifelong disabilities. Coursework actively involves students in critical thinking activities, where they examine and analyze theories and practices in teaching students in this domain. It also provides a foundation for candidates who may choose to pursue the post-Master's in Applied Behavior Analysis: Autism and Developmental Disabilities which fulfills the coursework required to obtain BCBA certification. Students may apply to receive New Jersey Certification as a Teacher of Students with Disabilities after the completion of the required 21 credits.

Admission Requirements

In addition to the University's admissions requirements:

- Baccalaureate with a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average
- Official transcripts from all institutions attended
- Three Letters of Recommendation (professional experience)
- An appropriate scholarly writing sample, APA style preferred
- Professional resume/CV
- Personal Statement
- *Official TOEFL or IELTS score reports (*International Students Only)
- New Jersey Instructional Certificate

- Two semesters of advanced seminar
