"Why should I go to grad school?"

Benefits of continuing education:

- Many areas of study require specialized training to reach your desired career path.
- You will gain more experience in specific areas you are interested in.
- You could gain more marketability in today's competitive job market. A graduate degree makes you stand out in a job search!

Check specific program requirements and tailor your experiences to what your goal programs look for!

How should I prepare?

- Reach out to admissions departments at your desired schools to confirm what tests are required and the average scores for accepted students.
- It is never too early to start studying. Kaplan, Khan Academy, and Princeton Review are all great resources for prep classes.
- Start writing your personal statement! Your advisor or mentor will be able to edit this for you.

What steps can I take for admission?

- Reach out to current or former students in your desired programs! They will be able to share admissions tips and can help you expand your network.
- Focus on your GPA, but don't focus only on your GPA. Most programs have baseline GPA requirements, but your application should boast more than just a high GPA.
 - Research, shadowing, internships, community service, or volunteer work all make an application more competitive!





Meet with your Career Advisor!

- Your career advisor can help you tailor your resume for grad schools, make recommendations for internships or other experiences, and provide other advice for admissions!
- Career Services also has networking opportunities, information sessions for specific programs or employers, or can help connect you with grad admissions officers.

Visit open houses to get individual glimpses of each program!



A gap year may help you if there are holes in the experience portion of your resume.



Strong letters of recommendation are vital. Build relationships with employers, advisors, professors, and mentors, and ask if they would be willing to write you a letter!
