CAIVIPUS SAFETY 101

RAVE ALERT

Kean University utilizes Rave Mobile Safety, a leader in mass notification and incident management, to communicate emergencies and share critical information and alerts to the campus community. Alerts and advisories are sent as text messages and emailed to your @kean.edu account. Depending on the nature of the alert, you may also receive a voicemail and/or see posts on Kean University's social media channels.

SAFETY ESCORTS

A Safety Escort may be requested anytime while on campus by calling our Communications Center at x74800. Escorts are provided on a first-come, first-served basis and are also prioritized amongst other calls for service at any given time.

BLUE LIGHT TELEPHONES

Blue Light telephones have been strategically placed at 13 outdoor locations throughout the campus. Use them for non-emergency and emergency situations. For non-emergencies, use the key pad to dial five-digit on-campus telephone numbers. For emergencies, push the red button. The number for our 24-hour Communications Center is x74800, or (908) 737-4800 from a cellular or off-campus phone.

PROHIBITED ITEMS & ACTIVITIES

The following are items and activities that are prohibited in all of the residence halls. Items are subject to confiscation if found in rooms during inspections or fire drills. Both items and prohibited activities are subject to disciplinary action in accordance with Kean University policies and procedures.

ACTIVITIES

- Covering smoke detectors or any action that interferes with the building fire detection system.
- Excessive accumulation of trash in the rooms. Take out the trash regularly!
- Moving furniture to create barriers or obstructions which may hinder egress from the
- Failure to promptly evacuate upon activation of the fire alarm.
- False activation of the fire alarm or discharging of the fire extinguishers.

ANIMALS

 No animals allowed (except fish in a 10 gallon tank or approved service/emotional support animals)

ELECTRONICS

- Transmitting equipment/CB radios
- Radio and TV masts or aerials (indoor antennas excluded)
- Lithium battery-powered transportation devices including storage on campus (ex: scooters, bikes, skateboards, hoverboards, etc.)

COOKING ITEMS

- Portable cooking appliances like rice cookers, waffle makers, air fryers, etc.
- · Toasters and toaster ovens
- Electric grills (such as George Foreman Grills) or skillets
- Hot plates
- Microwaves or mini-fridges (only those provided by Kean University are allowed)

LIGHTING

- Kerosene lamps and other highly flammable substances (such as gas-containing devices)
- Neon signs
- String lights (limit to 2 strings of decorative or holiday lights)

ROOM ITEMS

- Candles (including decorative candles)
- Incense
- Waterbeds
- Air Mattresses
- Heaters
- Fans with exposed blades
- · Any supplementary heating appliance (liquidfueled or electric)
- Dartboards
- Live Christmas trees
- Weightlifting apparatus
- Music amplifiers
- Resonators
- · Extension Cords
- Outlet adapters (only surge protectors are allowed with an on and off switch)
- Hairdryers requiring over 1500 watts of power
- Wall and ceiling hangings cannot exceed 50% of the aggregate wall space (ex: tapestries, posters, etc.)
- Furniture (ex: chairs, couches, mattresses, etc.) unless provided by Kean University

WEAPONS

- Firearms
- Paintball guns
- BB guns
- Fireworks
- Firecrackers
- Explosives
- · Chemicals
- Any kinds of knives

SMOKING, DRUGS, & ALCOHOL

- Cigarettes, cigars, cigarillos, etc.
- Vapor pens
- Hookahs
- Electric pens
- Drugs/narcotics and paraphernalia
- · Alcoholic beverages and paraphernalia
- Alcohol containers empty or full kegs of beer, "beer balls," or similar that are empty or full
